

LAMAR HASBROUCK, MD, MPH, MBA

Executive Biography

Lauded by his former board of directors for “making palpable progress by improving overall organizational performance,” Dr. LaMar Hasbrouck has made a palpable difference at every stop along his professional journey. A self-described “passionary” with a record of transforming organizations through his energized, authentic, empowering servant-style of leadership, Dr. Hasbrouck might not have become a professional of any kind if not for his strategic tenacity and creative dexterity in the face of seemingly insurmountable challenges. He went from inner-city poverty and earning Ds and Fs in middle school to earning the recognition as a Dean’s Scholar in medical school.

A dynamic strategist, Dr. Hasbrouck’s career took a ten-fold leap in responsibility when he was appointed by Illinois Governor Pat Quinn to lead the State’s Department of Public Health, an agency with a \$600 million budget which exceeded the entire budget for the County of Ulster, NY where he was the Commissioner for the Health and Mental Health departments immediately prior. Easily making the transition from managing 225 people in Ulster County to managing 1,200 people at an agency responsible for protecting the health and improving lives of 13 million residents, Dr. Hasbrouck embraced the challenge. He didn’t disappoint, championing performance improvement, transparency, and operational efficiencies. Within less than three years, he led the health department in modernizing their grant-making processes, developing a 5-year strategic plan, achieving national accreditation, while successfully negotiating the return of \$50 million in federal programs to the health department.

He was one of a few cabinet secretaries named to the Governor’s Office Health Innovation and Transformation team responsible for architecting a value-based holistic system of care for Illinoisan residents, including nearly 2 million uninsured. He also led other health reform initiatives, including chairing the statewide workgroups responsible for developing statewide blueprints for health workforce expansion and population health-healthcare integration. In large measure, because of his relatable and compelling presentation style and media savvy, Dr. Hasbrouck was appointed as one of only a few statewide spokespersons for the health insurance marketplace, *Get Covered Illinois*.

Dr. Hasbrouck went on to successful leadership roles as the CEO for the National Association for County and City Health Officials and Senior Advisor for the American Medical Association. These national associations support 160,000 public health professionals and 400,000 physicians and medical students, respectively. Currently, Dr. Hasbrouck is the managing director of DLM LLC, a boutique consulting firm that works with start-ups and established organizations to help bend the arc of wellness for individuals and communities. A dynamic leader who transforms objectives into collaborative actions often surpassing operational targets and goals, he is a consultative, confident, achiever comfortable partnering with C-suite executives and boards. A well-regarded personal brand, he excels in the spokesperson and company ambassador roles, positively raising the visibility and perceived value of organizations.

Dr. Hasbrouck is a graduate of UC Berkeley, UC Berkeley’s School of Public Health, and the UCLA/Drew School of Medicine. He earned an MBA from the University of Saint Mary and completed the certificate program for senior executives in state government at Harvard University’s John F. Kennedy School of Government. He has served on the faculties of medicine and public health and several national boards. He is a diplomat with the American Board of Internal Medicine, a former Epidemic Intelligence Service Officer at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and Primary Care Health Policy Fellow at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. He is the recipient of numerous awards for his governmental and non-governmental work.

Dr. Hasbrouck resides in Chicago, IL and is a proud father of three daughters, two in college (Clemson and Auburn) and one in law school (UC Irvine).
